1. Concern

Caring also refers to one's feelings, emotions, and needs. Tronto describes caring as achieving something other than oneself. Warmth, cheerfulness, meaningfulness, and connection are also often associated with caring (Tronto in Phillips, 2007). Jin clearly cares about Hye Na because she helps him cut her nails.

2. Happy

According to Seligman (2005), happiness is the result of an assessment of oneself and one's life, which includes both pleasurable feelings, such as comfort and joy, and positive actions that do not fulfill any emotional component, such as absorption and participation. So Jin is overjoyed in the following quote because, because of Hye Na, he is able to meet and hang out with his real mother, as well as hug his adoptive mother, who raised him. "Mom is now satisfied. Mom never imagined that she would become a mother, and she never imagined that she would see my biological mother again. Mother never imagined she would hug my mother, who raised me without regrets. But Mother is so happy now."



3. Responsibility

Burhanudin (2000:43). Responsibility is the capacity to choose one's attitude about an activity carried out as well as the ability to accept the harm from that action. One of So Jin's responsibilities goals is as follows: "I wanted to take Hye Na back there. But my mother passed away this morning. So taking Hye Na there now is a bit difficult. I will take her there the day after tomorrow. Thank you for your patience." You."

4. Affection

Affection, according to Soetjiningsih, is an expression of the process of reciprocal growth of love and affection between humans, as well as between generations, which is the foundation of happy family relationships. Soetjiningsih (Soetjiningsih, 1995:121). The following quote exemplifies one of the virtues of love: "Yoon Bok: I love mom."

5. Brave

According to Findley, Paul (1995: 10), courage is an attribute of protecting and fighting for what is right in the face of danger, difficulty, suffering, and other challenges. This phrase shows the courage "I am under the map, and I know how to go to Mooryung station since I read the map. Proceed after arriving at Cheongmyeong station by train."

6. Lie

Lying is the deliberate manipulation of facts, behavior, and self-image with the intent of persuading others to a wrong conclusion or view. Morissan (in Naja and Khilifah, 2020). This comment shows Hye Na's deception towards So Jin: "I told him that I tripped down the stairs, and he took my photo."

7. Violence

According to Robeert Audi (2001: 90), violence is defined as an attack or abuse of physical force against a person or animal; attack or destruction, extremely violent, violent, cruel and dangerous destruction of property or anything else that might belong to a person. Hye Na told So Jin that her birth mother often abused her, as seen by saying "She pushed me down the stairs too."

8. Stubborn

Stubbornness is the unwillingness to follow someone else's advice. They are resistant to changing their mind about something. Jin refused money given to him by his adoptive mother; he didn't want to take it, but his mother insisted since they traveled far away, so Jin accepted. Jin's obstinacy annoyed his mother. This is evident from the saying "You are not a mother yet. If you are a real mother, you should take the money, regardless of how much. How can you know what will happen to your child in the future? dependable for you other than that."
